What are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer, smartphone or other devices when you access the internet.

Why are cookies essential to our website?

This website, along with many others, uses cookies. The reason we use cookies is to let our users navigate around our websites and (where applicable) let us modify the content to meet the needs of our website visitors. If cookies are not enabled we cannot assure you that the website and your experience of it are as we intended it to be.

The cookies we use do not provide your personal information to us and they can't be used by us to identify you.

Types of cookies

The length of time a cookie stays on your device depends on its type.

Cookie Types

Strictly Necessary Cookies

These cookies enable services you have specifically asked for.

They are essential in order to enable you to move around the website and use its features, such as accessing secure areas of the website. Without these cookies services you have asked for, like forms and internet banking, cannot be provided.

Performance Cookies

These cookies collect anonymous information on the pages visited.

They collect information about how visitors use a website, for instance which pages visitors go to most often, and if they get error messages from web pages. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor. All information that these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. It is only used to improve how a website works.

Functional Cookies

These cookies remember choices you make to improve your experience.

They allow the website to remember choices you make (such as your user name, language or the region you are in) and provide enhanced, more personal features. These cookies can also be used to remember changes you have made to text size, fonts and other parts of web pages that you can customise. The information these cookies collect will be anonymised and they cannot track your browsing activity on other websites.

The analytics services we use

Google Analytics collects standard Internet log information to track visitor behaviour information as follows:

- Audience related data, including the city and country of origin, language preference, frequency of visits, all a visitor's activity during a single session, and operating system, service provider and device used to access the website.
- Traffic source data, including the ways visitors arrive at our website (for example search engines, referrals from other sites, marketing campaigns, and social media), keyword visitors entered into a search engine and that brought them to our website, and the landing and exit page used by which a visitor enters and leaves our website.
- Content related data, including measuring user visits and page views to determine the site's most popular content. Technical performance of the site as measured by such elements as average time taken to load a page and server speed, and technical performance broken down further by country and web browser.
- The information generated by cookies about your use of this website (including your IP address, truncated to ensure your anonymity) is transmitted to Google. This information is used to compile statistical reports on the website's activities and enhance the user online experience.
